Welcome to the Dutch coast!

Having visited the north, east and south of the Netherlands during previous Grand Chapitres, this year it is the turn of the west of the Netherlands.

Two western provinces of the Netherlands, North and South Holland, ensured that the Netherlands is also known worldwide as Holland. That period became known as the Golden Age.

The Golden Age is a period in Dutch history that largely coincides with the seventeenth century. The Republic of the Seven United Netherlands experienced a period of prosperity in the fields of trade, science and the arts. The Republic also occupied a prominent position in the world in terms of its political and military power (especially at sea). This period of prosperity, expressed in the metaphor Golden Age, is seen as an important new phase in the development of Western civilisation.

After the Haarlemmertrekvaart canal between the cities of Amsterdam and Haarlem was dug in 1631, a waterway between the Dutch cities of Haarlem and Leiden was dug in 1657 in about eight months using only manpower and horsepower. Construction began on 25 April and the first towboats sailed according to schedule on 1 November 1657.

At the time, this canal became the most important means of transport and cuts through the area where we hold the Grand Chapitre.

The Grand Hotel Huis ter Duin***** has been chosen as the base for our excursions and the venue for the Inauguration Ceremony and the gala dinner.

The hotel's director is Confrère Maître Hôtelier Stephan Stokkermans.

Museum Sophiahof

Currently, approximately two million people with a special connection to the former Dutch East Indies live in the Netherlands. They or their ancestors came to the Netherlands after the proclamation of the Republic of Indonesia. It was the largest wave of migration ever. Some of them thought their stay here would be temporary.

In the turbulent colonial history of the Netherlands, what we now know as Indonesia, the former Dutch East Indies, occupies a prominent place. It is a history that spans more than 400 years and continues to have an impact on our society to this day.

The long period of wars between 1941 and 1950 ultimately led to the arrival of hundreds of thousands of people in the Netherlands. The arrival of this war generation has had a major influence on the development of post-war Netherlands. Today, there are approximately two million citizens in our country who have a connection with what was once the Dutch East Indies. They illustrate our shared past. This remains relevant today because people are now taking a critical look at the colonial past, which was riddled with structural inequality. In addition, there is growing interest in the post-war period during the decolonisation of the late 1940s, the way in which the war generation shaped life in the Netherlands, and the way in which descendants deal with their identity. For the traces of this shared colonial past can be found in all walks of life: in literature, music, visual arts, theatre and other art forms, culture, science, sport and also in politics.

Indonesian rice table restaurant Toko Frederik

The entire team at Toko Frederik gives us a warm welcome. They do their utmost to serve us a delicious meal and provide us with the best possible service.

The dishes are cooked for hours in wadjans with fresh herbs over a low heat. Nowadays, this is called slow cooking. In Indonesia, the dishes are then left to cool and eaten at room temperature with warm rice. In the Netherlands, this would be very unusual. That is why the rice table dishes are heated before serving.
