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Currency Conversion

The đồng (/dɒŋ/; Vietnamese: ['dɜwnm]; sign: $\underline{\sigma}$; code: VND) has been the currency of Vietnam since May 3, 1978. Issued by the State Bank of Vietnam, it is represented by the symbol " $\underline{\sigma}$ ".

22,900 Vietnamese dong (VND) converts to approximately one US Dolllar (USD). Only licensed currency converters are allowed to convert foreign currency but it is not uncommon to receive a conversion of 20,000 VND through street vendors and shops.

Credit cards are widely accepted throughout Vietnam including in taxis. You will be required to sign in triplicate as the local banks are also mandated by law to keep a copy in their files.

Visa Arrangements

Members are reminded to have their travel documents and visas arranged well in advance of this upcoming event.

Attendees holding the following passports do not require a visa to enter:

All other nationals are advised to either visit a Vietnamese embassy or may reply back for an introduction to a reputable company that will arrange for visa issuance upon arrival.

Attendees who are not travelling on a Skyteam business class ticket to Ho Chi Minh can arrange for fast track through immigration for a nominal fee.

Health and Safety Considerations

Ho Chi Minh is a large-bustling city of 13 million residents and is unlike any other city in Vietnam. As in any large city, it is good to always stay vigilant against health risks and petty crime. Vietnam has almost no violent crime but it's best not to leave wallets on tables or purses and electronics unguarded.

When walking on the street, it is advisable that mobile telephones and other electronics remain in your pocket and when in crowded areas such as public markets, be sure to be consistently aware of your surroundings.

Street food is generally safe but those with weak constitutions should avoid. Similarly, not all water coming from taps may be potable. Ice is generally safe to drink and all locally-produced drinking waters are required by law to be sealed with a tamper proof plastic overlay to ensure it is not adulterated.

Please note that Vietnamese nightlife can be extremely loud. To be on the safe side, it is recommended that you consider wearing ear plugs if you plan to enjoy any local night spots. Please feel free to ask the a local Bailliage council member for a disposable pair in case you do not have any earplugs of your own.

Transportation

Ho Chi Minh City's denizens mostly use motorbikes for personal transport leaving leaving traffic to be fairly smooth-paced and efficient. Tan Son Nhat Airport is conveniently close to the centre of Ho Chi Minh City. It should take no longer than 25 to 30 minutes to reach your hotel even in the peak of rush-hour.

There are a number of taxi transport options but we recommend that you seek to use Vinasun or Mai Linh Taxis as both companies have strict policies relating to the conduct of their drivers as well as decent customer service.

All hotels and fine dining restaurants will have staff on hand to dispatch drivers as needed. You will never have to wait more than five to seven minutes for a taxi except for extreme circumstances (such as when Vietnam was victorious during the AFC U-23 Championship and the streets were completely flooded with revelers).

Taxi drivers from the above companies will never negotiate flat fares. The meter is automatic.

Both companies also have smartphone applications that will make your day to day life more convenient.

As at current, we do not recommend Grab, Southeast Asia's version of Uber.

Communications

Many countries do not have a mobile roaming agreement with Vietnam's communist-era carriers. Should you need to stay online during your visit, it is recommended that you acquire a SIM card upon arrival at Tan Son Nhat International Airport. We recommend VinaPhone and MobiFone as the preferred carriers that should give decent trouble-free internet access while in Vietnam.

The cost of a SIM card should not exceed VND 200,000 (approx. USD \$9).

For those who require less rigourous access to the internet, all hotels, cafes and restaurants in Vietnam offer free internet for their patrons.
